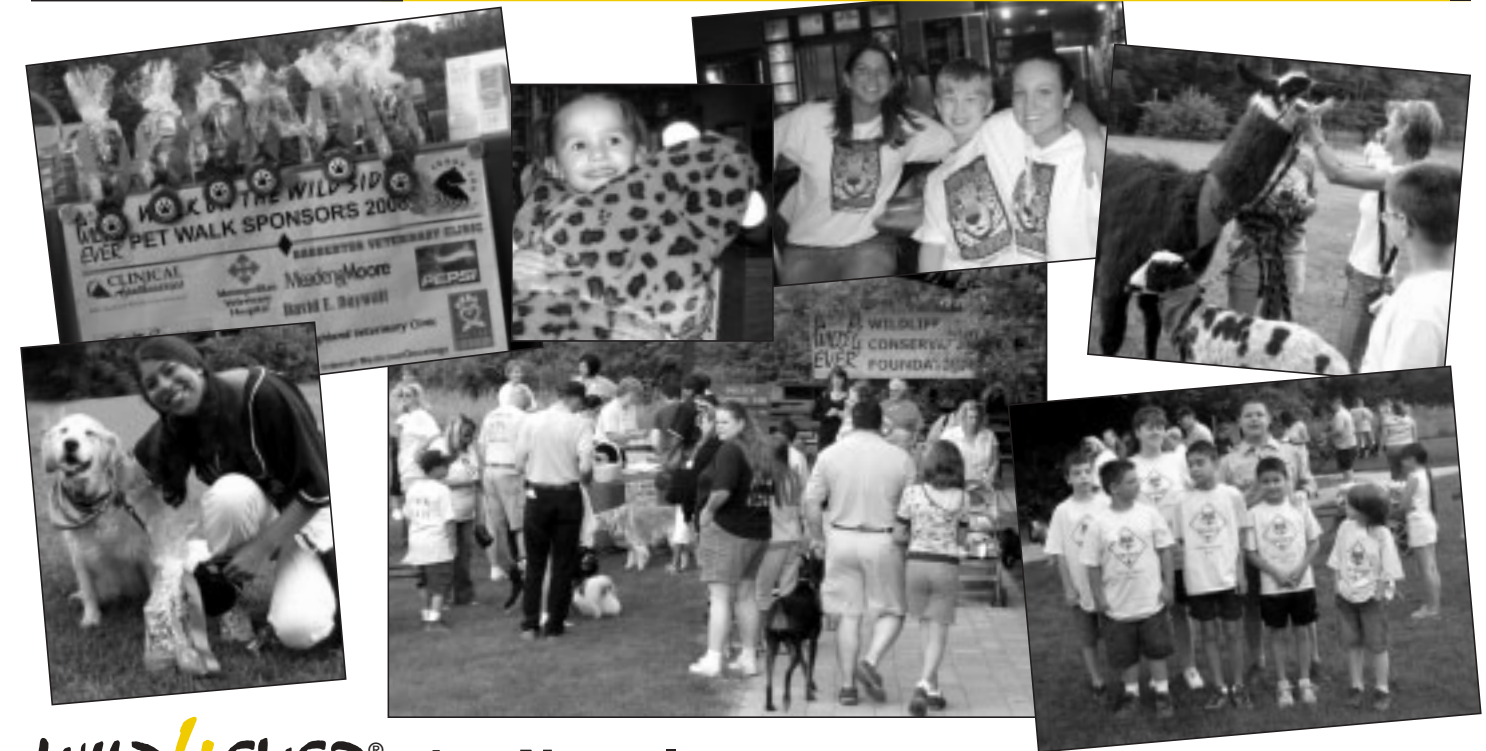

It is our pleasure to introduce you to Wild4Ever[®]. Wild4Ever[®] is an organization dedicated to the conservation of wildlife and wild spaces. Wild4Ever[®] is a nonprofit 501(c) (3) wildlife conservation foundation. We are committed to supporting conservation by selecting projects which most effectively utilize resources and are aligned with our principles of long-term conservation. We support projects that protect environments and contribute to local education programs aimed at highlighting the benefits and needs of people preserving what surrounds them.

Wild4Ever[®] is staffed by a group of dedicated volunteers so that all generated funds can go to help wildlife conservation. Even in our first year of existence, local support has

allowed us to fund a number of important projects both locally and worldwide.

Projects include Venezuelan Waterfowl Foundation, Jaguar Species Survival, Madagascar Fauna Group and Native Wildlife Rehabilitation. All of these projects protect and conserve wildlife and their habitats. You can learn more about them on page 2 of this newsletter.

In order to support these projects and future programs, Wild4Ever[®] has been actively raising funds. The Wild4Ever[®] team hosted the second annual Bowling for Jaguars in May. All the funds raised from this bowling event help support jaguar conservation in Mexico and Panama. In June, Wild4Ever[®] hosted its first

pet walk at Silver Creek Metroparks. This event supported local wildlife by providing funds to local wildlife rehabilitation centers in Summit and Medina counties. The funds help rehabilitate native wildlife so the animals can be returned to the wild.

Projects

WILD4EVER® is currently contributing and participating in the following conservation projects:

Venezuelan Waterfowl Foundation

Wild4Ever® is an active supporter of this Venezuelan non-governmental, non-profit conservation foundation founded in 1999 by conservation professionals in the United States and Venezuela. This group works to preserve habitat and protect endangered waterfowl species. Field research, education and habitat support are all utilized in this important on-going program to protect a threatened ecosystem. Current projects involve field research to preserve the torrent duck and setting up nest boxes to help endangered Orinoco geese.

Jaguar Species Survival

Wild4Ever® supports conservation of this flagship specie through the Jaguar Species Survival Plan. We currently support field research and sustainable habitat for jaguars in Yucatan, Mexico and Panama. The use of hidden cameras, along with other research techniques, help to determine the number of jaguars in their range habitat and how they are using their territory. This information is vital to helping to protect the habitat for the survival of jaguars.

Madagascar Fauna Group

Wild4Ever® is proud to be a contributing member of the Madagascar Fauna Group. This group of conservation and wildlife professionals has been working for nearly 20 years with a combination of conservation, field research, education and training to help project one of the most diverse and endangered ecosystems in the world. Projects include environmental education programs for school children, village mayors and farmers, as well as, species diversity mapping and the development of seed germination techniques for endangered rain forest plants.

Native Wildlife Rehabilitation

We believe conservation starts at home and as such, Wild4Ever® supports a number of quality wildlife rehabilitation centers and education groups including Project Orphan, Medina Raptor Center and Ohio Division of Wildlife.

Dear Friends & Supporters,

As morning broke over the forest lake with the colors of yellow, orange and red painting the sky, I heard them first before they appeared in front of me, rare and wild in their native home. Spotting this wild pair of white-wing wood ducks in the heart of Cambodia was my reward for days of trekking through the forest to search for the home of this highly endangered waterfowl species.

I was in Cambodia to lay the foundation for a white-winged wood duck nest site program. This program is a collaborative effort between the Cambodia government, the Wildlife Conservation Society, the Akron Zoo and Wild4Ever to encourage local farmers and villagers to protect the nest sites of white-winged wood ducks. Just \$100 a year would help support an entire family in Cambodia while they protect the critically endangered waterfowl, whose habitat is threatened by development and human encroachment. A small price to pay!

The white-winged wood duck nest site program is just one example of how a contribution to Wild4Ever® is being used to conserve and protect wildlife in their native habitat. Other projects include the protection of endangered jaguars in the jungles of Panama. This project is off to a fantastic start and is already saving jaguars that would normally be killed and, serves as a gathering spot for scientists working to save the animals and wild habitat of Central America. We also believe in help at home, and sponsor numerous local Ohio wildlife rehabilitation facilities, as well as supporting additional conservation projects in Mexico and Madagascar.

We need your help to reach our goal of raising \$25,000 for the 2008 Annual Conservation Fund. 100% of the funds raised from this annual campaign will go to support conservation projects. Your commitment and support is essential to help us save wildlife and wild habitats for future generations of animals and people to enjoy!
